Dream, Aspire, Succeed

Dear Parents/Carers

We are well into the Autumn Term and there is a real buzz in the school both from learning energy and thoughts of Christmas on the horizon!

Before half term we received a visit from a National Leader of Education, who carried out a full review of the quality of education in the school. He spent a lot of time in classrooms throughout the day, and spoke to a range of school staff. He provided an absolutely glowing report of the school, sharing that the education we provide is well above that of a typical 'good' school. We are really proud of this outcome and know it reflects the effort our staff put in to provide the very best educational experience for your children.

The brilliant outcome above sits very well alongside the extremely pleasing national analysis of our KS2 results.

- For Reading progress we are in the top 8% of all schools in the country
- For Maths progress we are in the top 8% of all schools in the country
- For Writing progress we are in the top 15% of all schools in the country
- For the percentage of children that reached greater depth in Maths, we are in the top 3% of all schools in the country.

We continue to provide some fantastic enrichment experiences, and our recent KS2 author visit from Louie Stowell really brought children's understanding of 'the craft of writing' to life. She really helped children understand her inspirations and motivations, and how she had generated ideas for her stories.

On the same topic of books, our recent book fair was a huge success. Thank you to all the parents who accompanied their children to choose a new book. Every book purchased provides funds to the school. I am pleased to share that we raised £783 in total for the school to spend on books to further enhance our school library and reading corners in classrooms.

Earlier today, we held our Remembrance Service in the school hall. This was a poignant service, which included some beautiful artwork from across the school and some lovely poetry readings from our Year 6 children.

Members of FoRC and their chair, Rebecca Strugnell, have been very busy during this Autumn Term, and the recent discos were a great success. They were enjoyed by all, and over £1000 was raised for the school. We are all set for the FoRC fireworks tonight and it promises to be a lovely evening. I look forward to seeing many of you at the school later on!

The Preschool refurbishment is on course to be ready for January 2024, and we are all excited by this prospect. As part of this, we are installing a new exit mechanism with a key pad, that is both secure and user friendly. I know the temporary measure of a push button and a key safe has caused some difficulties - thank you for your patience and understanding.

Please can I ask all parents to adhere to the following safe parking guidelines

- Please do not park opposite the diagonal yellow lines at the end of the drive. Many children cross the road there
 and it is unsafe to park and pull away from there.
- Please do not drop off in the actual drive of the school
- Please do not park up on curbs and grass verges.

It is every parents responsibility to ensure we keep drop off and pick up safe for children, and sacrificing a little time (for example by parking further up the road) can make a big difference to children's safety.


