Last week we all enjoyed the visit of Matt Lucas (well known actor, and TV presenter) who gave an inspiring talk about his latest children's book. He also gave his tips on how to be a great writer and he shared some facts about himself along the way! This week the children in Year 4 had an immersive Tudor experience on their residential trip to Ufton Court. 

Multi Sports Club Tilsley Park, Abingdon

We would like to invite children in local Primary Schools to take part in a free, weekly Multi Sports Club, as part of Abingdon School in Partnership.

The club is run by Abingdon School Student Coaches and supervised by Teachers and Coaches from our Sports department. The club will run on Thursdays at Tilsley Park, 4:00 - 4.50pm starting in January and is open to children in Years 5 and 6 from local partner schools.
