#### Dear Parents/Carers

We have had a great start to 2023 at Rush Common School, with a particularly busy week for Year 6! They started their swimming lessons on Monday, and then yesterday performed their curriculum assembly to parents based on World War II. It was a really polished performance, that demonstrated the depth of learning and enjoyment of this topic. They were also not phased by the air ambulance landing on our school field just before the assembly!

Thank you to everyone who completed our parent survey. There was a really good response, and some very pleasing results. Some of the highlights from the survey are below

99% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child is happy at this school 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child is safe at this school 96% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child does well at this school 98% of parents would recommend this school to another parent.

There were so many positive comments in the survey, and also a number of useful suggested improvements. From analysing the comments section, one particular area to improve on is communication. We will be working on this as a school and will update you with any changes we make.

We are really looking forward to our new Boost! Drama Club this Term. It promises to be a really fantastic opportunity for children interested in drama and performing, and comes with great reviews. We feel this really complements our clubs offering, with a new KS1 Wildlife Club and History Club also starting this term. We are always looking to ensure this aspect of our provision is as broad as possible. Therefore, if any parents are interested in running a club in a particular area of expertise, please do contact the school.

This half term our PSHE topic for the whole school is 'Dreams and Goals'. Mrs Drew, our PSHE Lead launched this topic with a brilliant assembly on Monday, which really engaged the children, and asked them to consider their own short term and long term goals. They will have weekly PSHE lessons on this topic for this half term, which will include recognising and celebrating achievement, overcoming obstacles, motivation and enthusiasm, dreams for the future, jobs and careers and making a difference in the world.

The topics for this term in Years 1 - 6 are all based on Geography, after the History topics of Term 1. A tour of the school now involves a journey around the world, as you travel to Australia in Year 1, Africa in Year 2, China in Year 3, other parts of Asia in Year 4, Brazil in Year 5 and North America in Year 6! The children cover all the aspects of the geography curriculum through studying these countries, whilst also broadening their understanding of different parts of the world, and making comparisons to the UK.

As we move forward into this new year, I would like to wish all our families all the very best for 2023, and a safe and enjoyable weekend ahead.


