Dear Parents/Carers

It has been a really busy start to the half term, with children participating in many events across the school that are linked to their personal development. This week has been Anti-Bullying Week, and the week started with an assembly from Mrs Drew and our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors about the theme of the week – Power for Good. The start of Anti-Bullying Week was also Odd Socks Day, in which everyone came to school wearing odd socks to show what makes us all unique and different. This perfectly complements our current PSHE topic for all children of 'Celebrating Difference'. The importance of children grasping concepts of diversity, equality and inclusion cannot be understated in our world today.

On Tuesday we held a poignant Rembrance Service at the school. It was impeccably observed by all of our children, and involved laying poppy wreaths (made by children across the school), a poetry recital from Year 6 and our two Rembrance Service songs 'Keep the Home Fires Burning' and 'It's a Long Way to Tiperary'. The children were very proud to receive their badges in the assembly last Friday and they had a meeting this week. I know they will represent the views of the children in the school admirably.

Every Friday, Mrs Barnes carries out Team Building and Orienteering activities with children in Key Stage 2. Each class has a block of four weeks, which really develops communication skills, confidence and the ability to work successfully with others towards achieving a goal. Currently, it is the turn of class 3HC and I know they are really enjoying these activities.

Last Friday was our annual Fireworks Display, which really went off with a bang! The fireworks were as impressive as ever and even the light drizzle throughout the evening couldn't dampen the spirits of those at the event. Thank you to everyone who attended and I am told it has made over £4,000 for the school! A huge thank you to Rebecca Strugnell, Chair of FoRC, for organising the event and the team of volunteers who helped make the evening such a success.

Thank you to all the parents that have attended important meetings in school over the last fortnight. Firstly, the Ufton Court Year 4 Residential Information Evening was very well attended, and we hope it was useful in preparing your child for this fantastic first residential trip. If you would like to request an All Yours box to support you over Christmas, please could you make your request by Thursday 11th December to ensure we have time to get your box to you before Christmas.

We offer disposable products, reusable pads, and menstrual cups. If you're ordering for more than one person, just note this in the comments box. Boxes are prepared and delivered by volunteers, so please allow up to 21 days for delivery (though most arrive much sooner). If we can't deliver to you directly, we'll let you know how to find your nearest collection point.

All Yours will be closed between Monday 22nd December and Sunday 4th January 2026. Normal service will resume on Monday 5th January and all emails and messages received during the Christmas closure will be responded to from then.
