Dear Parents/Carers

I would like to start this newsletter with our fantastic Cross Country Teams who competed in the Vale Finals on Wednesday13th November. We have some very talented runners across Key Stage 2 and we had by far the biggest team (and supporters) at the event! The children competed brilliantly and both our Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 Girls Teams have made it through to the Oxfordshire Finals. I will update you on how they get on. A special mention for Jacob in Year 4, who won his race, beating all other competitors across the Vale in his age group. Congratulations to you all!

On Friday 8th November we held our Fireworks Evening and it was absolutely spectacular! Once again we had the stilt walker at the event but the new addition this year was the fire show, which was a fantastic flaming hot build up to the main event. The crescendo to the fireworks display was truly amazing, as was the number of spectators. Nearly 1000 people attended the event, and it raised an incredible £4,600 for the school. A huge thank you to everyone who came to the fireworks and volunteered, with a special mention to Rebecca Strugnell (Chair of FoRC) who organised the event superbly.

Thank you to all the parents who attended Parents' Evenings this week. I hope you all had useful and informative meetings, and had a chance to see your children's workbooks. We are very proud of the academic and personal progress children make in our school and it is important to be able to share this with you. We were particularly pleased to offer ELSA drop ins for parents, and we hope this was useful. Last week, we held our first Key Stage 2 House Competition of this year. The children feel a real sense of belonging to their particular House Teams, and the competitive spirit across the school was great to see. Children took part in Cross Country, English quizzes and Times Table Rockstar competitions with real conviction to earn points for their house. The overall winners were Kites, but as always at Rush Common, the children were humble in victory, and gracious in defeat!

Our pupils always enjoy the breadth of enrichment opportunities we provide. Last week, Year 2 dressed up as Romans, spending the whole day carrying out Roman activities, on Thursday 7th November Year 5/6 children took part in the Primary Maths Challenge, Year 4 enjoyed Science Workshops at Abingdon School today, and this week everyone in KS2 has had the opportunity to join England Rocks (the Timestable Rockstars National Competition).

On Monday 11th November, we held a very poignant Remembrance Service for the whole school. The children placed wreaths they had made on our mound by the playground, and Year 6 recited the poem 'In Flanders Fields'. A one minute's silence was impeccably observed and the children understood the significance of the service. We also placed a poppy wreath from Rush Common School on the War Memorial for the Rembrance Service in Abingdon last Sunday.

This week has been Anti-Bullying Week and the theme for the week has been to 'Show Respect'. Our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors joined Mrs Drew in sharing this message with the rest of the school in assembly, and there have been activites provided to classes to help understand this further. The children at Rush Common have become very aware of the specific definition of bullying, and know that it will never be tolerated in our school.

In recent weeks we have been busy supporting a variety of very worthwhile causes. Firstly, our school provided a huge collection of food for Abingdon Food Bank, and I can confirm the weight was a massive 243 kg. Just before half term we supported 'Show Racism the Red Card' for which we raised over £300. We have also been raising money for the Poppy Appeal and Children in Need today. I will update you on the totals in the next Newsletter. Thank you everyone for your contributions towards such important charities.

Finally, a thank you to everyone that attended our SEND Coffee Afternoon this week. We had a speaker from CAMHS who outlined the important work they carry out. We hope this was useful for everyone who attended.


