#### Dear Parents/Carers

It is really feeling like Christmas at Rush Common School, and our recent nativity performances have certainly put us in the Christmas mood. Last week Year 1 and 2 performed to large audiences on two evenings, and treated us all to some fantastic acting and singing as we were led through the Christmas story. This week it was the turn of Reception children to provide a lovely performance on two afternoons. The children delivered their lines clearly and sung their hearts out, and I know the staff and parents were very proud of their first performance at Rush Common School. These first shows are very important to our pupils as they grow and develop confidence over time in performing to others, culminating in the Year 6 performance at the end of their journey through Rush Common School.

I would like to take this opportunity to give a hugely appreicative thank you to parents for all the donations that have been received across the course of the Nativity performances. This included both online and cash donations, and totals an incredible £518. Your generosity is so warmly received and every penny will be put towards additional educational resources.

Last week, our Year 4 children had a brilliant time at Ufton Court on their first residential trip at Rush Common School. We think very carefully about our enrichment and educational trip opportunities, and had taken the decision to move this residential to Ufton Court, primarily due to the quality of the Tudor experience the children receive. We were not disappointed! The children had the most fantastic immersive experience that brought their understanding of the Tudor era to life in the best possible way – this included staying in a real Tudor Manor House, experiencing a Tudor court case, investigating 'strange goings on' in the manor and a fully costumed Tudor banquet. I'm sure this trip has created life long memories for our children!

Prior to the Year 4 residential, our Year 6 children also had a fully immersive WW2 experience at the STEAM museum. The children all dressed up as evacuees, complete with gas mask box, and lunch appropriate for the era. It was once again a hugely enjoyable trip, with so much learning taking place, cementing lots of the knowledge gained in children's lessons in school.

Last Friday, we held our first Reception open afternoon, in which we invited all of our Reception parents to see their children in school, enjoying activities in our continuous provision, and making a range of Christmas craft items. This was a great opportunity for those new to the school, to come inside the classrooms and see what their children experience each day. We hope it was a really enjoyable afternoon, and we know the children loved having you there!

Our choir have been out and about recently, and they followed up a superb performance at the Oxford 'Big Christmas Sing', with another lovely event at Smeg UK Ltd. The children once again sung their hearts out to the delight of the audience! A huge thank you for the donations that were received from Smeg.

As you may well know, we have a very musical staff, who play a variety of instruments. Mrs Wallis on saxophone, Mrs Ramm on cello, Mr Mulders on double bass, Mrs Neal on piano, Mrs Lipp and Mrs Carr on violins, were joined by some friends and a parent of the school on flute, trumpet and viola, to create an amazing orchestra for our Christmas singalong this week. The children loved hearing the orchestra and hugely enjoyed singing along to some christmas classics!

Today is our Christmas dinner day, with children also making Christmas crafts during the afternoon. The year groups have purchased items to provide for an exciting afternoon making items to sell to parents. Please refer to the recent letter on how to purchase these Christmas crafts online. The total profit raised will be spent by each year group on important resources to support children's education.

As we look forward to next term, please can I ask that any parents driving to school, park safely and respectfully of our residents, including not parking next to drop down kerbs or on grass verges.


