#### Dear Parents/Carers

Last Friday, Dr. Jeffery Quaye (OBE) visited our school to carry out a thorough review on the quality of education. He is a former Headteacher, whose roles now include Lead Ofsted Inspector, National Director for Education and Standards at Aspirations Academies Trust, and a DfE Education Policy Advisor. He visited numerous lessons in a range of subjects throughout the day, visited Preschool, spoke to many children in and out of learning time, looked through workbooks, and spoke to many school leaders and staff. Overall, he was highly impressed with the quality of education and I have provided the following quotes from his feedback.

- 'Pupils thrive at this school and are exceptionally polite and well-mannered'
- 'Pupils are happy and kept safe in school and staff provide high quality care for pupils'
- 'Leaders are ambitious and there is complete determination that pupils will excel irrespective of their starting point.'
- 'The curriculum is meticulously planned and teachers have strong subject knowledge, which they use skilfully to model work and probe pupils understanding of key concepts'
- · "Pupils present their work beautifully and produce high-quality work that is consistent with the demands of the curriculum."

We are extremely proud of this feedback, and will continue to strive to provide the very best possible education for our pupils as we move forward this year.

We are also extremely proud of our Cross Country teams, who participated in the locality competition at Tilsley Park last Monday. There were four teams that competed against many different schools in the local area. We won the Year 3/4 Girls Competition, the Year 3/4 Boys Competition and the Year 5/6 Girls Competition, and came 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Year 5/6 Boys Competition. This is an incredible achievement, and demonstrates the breadth of sporting talent across KS2. A huge thank you to Mrs Barnes for preparing the children superbly for this event.

We provide excellent enrichment activites in History, and this week Year 1 had an absolutely fascinating experience as they enjoyed a Dinosaur Workshop on Tuesday morning. Year 5 also had a very enjoyable trip out to the Oxfordshire Museum as part of their Victorians topic. On both occasions the children developed such deep and broad knowledge from people who are experts in these areas of History.

Last week we held our second Open Morning this year for prospective new parents. It is a lovely occasion for us to show the opportunities that exist at our school, and we always have parents attend that have heard great things about our school. Please keep spreading these positive messages as word of mouth is really important.

On Tuesday last week, we held our FoRC Second Hand Uniform Sale. The turnout was huge and we sold over £360 of uniform. Not only is this great for raising money, it is a more sustainable and affordable way to purchase uniform. A huge thank you to Vicky Dobson, who organises the second hand uniform, and to everyone who donated items for the sale.

In the last newsletter I mentioned the recent book fair, and we took a massive total of £1518. This took us over the £1500 threhold, which meant that we received 60% in rewards. Therefore this book fair made £911 for the school. A huge thank you to everyone who purchased a book or two.

Thank you to everyone who has donated an item to Abingdon Foodbank this week. I delivered an assembly on Monday to all of the children about the importance of supporting the foodbank and the response has been incredible!

I hope you all have an enjoyable and safe half term break and we look forward to seeing you all on Monday 4th November.














## Multi Sports Club Tilsley Park, Abingdon
