#### Dear Parents/Carers

I will start this newsletter by sharing a fabulous assembly delivered by four of our Year 6 pupils this week. Throughout the month of October, children across the school engaged in lessons relating to black history. During their learning about inspirational black heroes of the past, they developed a strong passion to share their understanding with the rest of the school. In particular, they wanted to ensure everyone understood how these figures had helped allow future generations to live in a more equal society. Therefore they approached the leadership team, organised and practiced their assembly during break times and finally delivered their assembly on Monday. They focused on Rosa Parkes, Martin Luther King and Barack Obama, and shared information using both a powerpoint presentation and videos – the rest of the school were spellbound! In preparing and carrying out this Assembly independently from inception to delivery, the pupils demonstrated the type of learning characterisitcs we look to develop in pupils throughout their journey at Rush Common School.

We are all starting to gear up towards Christmas and our KS1 and Reception children have been practicing their nativity performances that take place over the next two weeks. This is a lovely opportunity for children to perform in front of a live audience, and we find it really helps develop pupils confidence. We know this will be a special moment for our Reception parents, with it being the children's first nativity in school, but also our Year 1 parents, who were only able to watch online last year. We cannot wait to share these performances with you and the children are really excited!

We pride ourselves on the enrichment opportunites we provide across the curriculum, and over the last fortnight a number of events have taken place. Last Wednesday was our annual BeepBeep! Day where our younger children learnt all about the importance of road safety, and dresed up in highly visible clothing! This Wednesday we held our Year 2 Roman Day, in which children engaged in a wide array of Roman activities, including building their own amphitheatres, designing Roman coins, learning Latin and baking honey biscuits. This really brought the topic to life, and created such memorable experiences! Finally, our Choir were out at the 'Big Christmas Sing' this week joining eleven other schools at Oxford Town Hall. The children sang their hearts out and as always, were superb ambassadors for our school.

Pupil leadership is an important part of our school, and where we can, we link this to real life jobs. This week, twelve of our Year 6 children took part in Junior Newbury Building Society training. The branch manager for the Newbury Building Society, came to our school and spent the morning training our pupils to be cashiers for the Rush Common Branch of the JNBS. Going forward these pupils will open the branch once a week, and children in the school can deposit money with the cashiers, which is then securely deposited at Newbury Building Society by a member of staff. This is a lovely opportunity for both pupil leadership and teaching our pupils about money and spending, as well as the importance of good saving habits. A letter will go out to parents detailing when the branch will be open.

As we all start our preparations for Christmas, in the unusual company of a World Cup, I hope everyone has a really enjoyable and safe weekend ahead.
