## Dear Parents/Carers

The last week of the first half term was filled with exciting and important events for our children. At the beginning of that week we had a brilliant visit from children's author, Sarah Coyle. Our KS1 children were engrossed as the art of writing children's books was brought to life. The children had so many fantastic questions to ask, and it was clear to see it had inspired some budding authors of the future!

On the Tuesday before half term, we had the Reception party, which was followed by the KS1 and KS2 discos on the Thursday, organised by FoRC. The children had a fantastic time at all of the discos' showing off some great dance moves - the teachers even got involved too! A huge thank you to FoRC for another brilliantly organised event, and I can confirm that almost $£ 1,000$ was rasied. This will be spent on improving the educational provision for pupils.

On the Wednesday, we then had a visit from M\&M productions to perform the Jungle Book pantomime to all of our children. The children loved every minute of it, and our thanks again go to FoRC whose fundraising allowed the event to happen.

The Thursday of that week, saw our first Intra School House Competition during the afternoon. All the children in KS2 competed for their house in cross country, Times Tables Rock Stars and English activities. It was lovely to raise the profile of our house teams through this event, and the children really loved the team spirit, and earning points for their house. The overall winners for the afternoon were Kestrels, and all members of the team were proud to have won the first of these events. We are looking forward to two more similar events this academic year.

On the last day of the half term, we held our annual 'Wear Red Against Racism' day. The children and staff came to school wearing red items of clothing, in so doing, continuing the important message that there is no place for racism in our world. We raised £320, half of which will be donated to an anti-racism charity and the rest on educational resources in our school that celebrate difference.

Throughout this last week of the half term, children also brought in countless bags of food for the Abingdon Foodbank. In total, we contributed 141 kg ! This will all go to those most in need of this essential service. Thank you to all the parents that sent their children in with food to support this very worthy cause.

This half term has started really well, and today all the children have enjoyed coming to school in non-school uniform for another very worthy cause - to raise the profile of the Trust's net zero carbon commitment, and donate money to the Woodland Trust. The fundraising will contribute to the Woodland Trust aims of helping to combat climate change, provide homes for wildlife and reducing pollution levels. Thank you for your support with this today.

Thank you also to all the parents that came and purchased a book or two for their children at our book fair. There was a really great turnout and the total raised was an impressive $£ 1415$ ! From this total, the school receives over $£ 700$ to spend on books that can be enjoyed by all the pupils in our school.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all parents and carers, not to let children play on the adventure playground and Reception garden climbing frame at drop off or pick up. These areas are not supervised during this time. We will also remind all pupils in school today during assembly, but it is important that this message is continually reinforced by parents.

Finally, we are all very excited for our first ever fireworks night next Friday. It promises to be a spectacular evening, and I look forward to seeing many of you at the event. A huge thank you to Rebecca Strugnell and FoRC in advance for their impressive organisation.
