This week our Year 4 pupils have been out on their first residential trip to Ufton Court. It was an incredible immersive Tudor experience, in which a whole array of Tudor activities were enjoyed, including a role play at the manor house and a Tudor banquet on the second evening. A huge thank you to all the staff that attended the trip and made it so special for the children!

We have also been enjoying our KS1 Nativity productions this week. Parents turned out in huge numbers to see their children perform, and they were sensational! I am sure everyone left the hall really feeling the Christmas spirit, and I know the children hugely enjoyed putting on the show. We are often very successful in sporting competitions, and cross country is no different. In October, all of our cross country teams progressed to the Vale Finals, which were held last week. All the children competed fantastically well and special congratulations to Cody in Year 4 and Isla in Year 5 who both came third for their age group! Thank you to Mrs Barnes for her commitment in preparing the children so well for these events.

We continue to offer a broad range of enrichment experiences and last week it was the turn of Year 2 to get all dressed up in their Roman outfits and enjoy an immersive Roman experience for the day. The children loved the activities, and it really complemented all the knowledge about the Romans they have been soaking up over the course of this term! Year 5 have also been out this week to Our Lady's Abingdon for an exciting Science Workshop looking at crystals!

We have a number of Christmas events on the horizon for the remainder of the Autumn Term. Next Monday and Tuesday is our Reception Nativity, which we know will be a delight! Then it's Christmas dinner day on Wednesday, followed by our whole school 'Singalong' Carols on Friday, and our Reception Christmas craft open afternoon. 
