Dream, Aspire, Succeed

Dear Parents/Carers

Happy New Year! As you know, 2026 at Rush Common School started with an Ofsted Inspection. Everyone at the school saw this as an opportunity to demonstrate what a fantastic school we are and really rose to the occasion. As well as the staff, this was also true of the children (whose behaviour and approach to learning was superb) and the parents, who had many great things to say about the school both in person to inspectors on the gate and through the Parent Survey. It was hugely inspiring to see the entire school community step up to demonstrate and celebrate the way children progress and develop throughout our school, and I am hugely grateful to everyone for this. The final report is likely to be ready to be shared publicly in February and I am hopeful this will be before the Half Term break.

On Thursday, Year 1 headed off to Australia on a long haul flight. It was certainly much warmer when they got off the plane! This exciting start to their topic sets them up for the huge amount of learning about Australia this term. In fact, the whole school will be awash with learning from every continent of the world as Reception look at the North and South Pole, Year 2 study Africa, Year 3 develop their understanding of Europe, Year 4 learn about some of the countries and cultures in Asia, Year 5 study South America and Year 6, North America. The opportunity to learn about other parts of the world and make comparisons to the UK is really important for children to understand the world they live in.

Whilst a walk around the school next week will be like a walk around the world, a trip to the library will involve going into Space! This is because the library has been transformed into an 'Out of This World' area for the Prayer and/or Reflection Space. This magical environment will be visited by every year group in the school next week, and they will be able to reflect on themselves and others around them. Everyone has such busy lives and learning the importance of quiet reflection is invaluable.

The reflection space nicely complements the whole school PSHE topic this term of 'Dreams and Goals'. Children had an Assembly on Monday to launch this topic and they will be spending time in PSHE lessons considering their interests and passions, how they would like to develop themselves and their skills, and how to develop resilience to overcome barriers. The topic culminates in Year 6, where children understand their own personal learning goals in and out of school, how to recognise achievement, and make a difference in the world.

Our PSHE topic fits well with our DRME sessions in school, which take place towards the end of January. This is for children in Key Stage 2 to understand the importance of diet, resilience, mind and exercise in terms of their overall health, and we know they always really enjoy the sessions.

Finally, I would like to thank parents for completing our annual Parent Survey and I know many of you will have completed two quite similar surveys with the timing of Ofsted. The survey has now closed and an initial look at the results are really pleasing. I will be able to share some of the headline results from this survey in the next newsletter.

I would like to wish everyone a safe and enjoyable weekend ahead and hope that 2026 is a happy and successful year for you all.

Please note: If you are requesting boxes for more than one person (for example, multiple family members), please indicate the number of boxes needed and any specific product requirements in the comments box on the request form. This helps us make sure everyone receives what they need.

Boxes are prepared and delivered by volunteers, so please allow up to 21 days (though most arrive much sooner).

If we can't deliver to you directly, we'll let you know how to find your nearest collection point.
