Dear Parents/Carers

Yesterday was the 80th Anniversary of VE Day, and in school we marked this occasion with a range of activities in class related to VE Day. We also held a two minute silence to remember and thank those who fought for our freedom during World War Two. Children really understood the significance of the occasion and learnt a little more about this important moment in history.

Last week we had an author visit from Greg James (Radio 1 Presenter), who has co-written a series of books with Chris Smith. It was a thoroughly entertaining talk, and it was great to have such a well known personality presenting in our hall. Children from Thomas Reade and Dunmore primary schools also came to the event, and a fantastic selection of questions were asked. We certainly have some budding authors of the future!

Across the last two weeks, each of our Year 2 classes have been out visiting Abingdon Museum. It was lovely for our children to visit a local attraction, and meant we were able to walk from school. They gained a huge amount of knowledge about the Anglo-Saxons and really enjoyed the workshop provided by the museum. As always we received great praise for the impeccable behaviour of all our children on the trip.

Last week, Year 4 delivered a fantastic Curriculum Assembly to parents, showcasing much of their learning from this Term. The way the children delivered their lines and carried out their roles in the assembly showed such confidence, and the depth of learning was clear for all to see. As part of the assembly, a hugely memorable recital of Macavity the Mystery Cat was delivered with impressive accuracy and gusto!

Speaking of performance poetry, in last week's Celebration Assembly, Year 1 gave a wonderful recital of the poem 'The Great Fire of London' by Paul Perro. The way they all kept to the rhythm of the poem and were articulate was very impressive, and the poem was hugely enjoyed by everyone in the hall.

On Wednesday 7th May Year 3 and 4 competed in the Abingdon Schools Red Tennis Competition. The whole team performed brilliantly, showing determination and talent in equal measure. They came second out of eight teams and should be hugely proud of their performances. Congratulations to you all!

Pupil Leadership roles are important at Rush Common and this term our Year 5 Play Leaders are supporting younger children at lunchtimes. The children take their roles very seriously, and take great care in setting up games and activities on the field for children in KS1. It is lovely to see the confidence of the Year 5 children blossoming in this role!

Today Year 4 have been visiting Abbey Fishponds, to understand the positive impact humans can have on the environment. This involved observing wildlife in action, and it was a very enjoyable trip for all of the children.

Next week we wish all of our Year 6 children good luck as they complete the SATs. They have been well prepared and we know they are going into the week with confidence. They are particularly looking forward to the SATs breakfast!
